This is a letter to our granddaughters and grandsons, to first-time voters, to all democrats,

For millions of you, the European election is the first election in your life.

For many of us, it could be the last.

We trust in the young generation, we trust in you! We admire your zest for life, your commitment to a better and more just world. And we also understand your frustration about many things in this country and in this world that do not work as they should. But believe us, not voting is not a solution.

Democracy is all of us. Young and old. Grandparents and grandchildren. Jews, Christians, Muslims, Atheists. It is up to all of us to make this country and this Europe what we dream it to be. Millions have already taken to the streets this year to protest against right-wing extremism, and that gives us hope.

A united, peaceful Europe is a wonderful gift for all of us. We can well remember a time when that seemed unthinkable.

So: Give democracy a chance. Go vote. Let's show together that "Never Again" is not just a phrase, but a promise. A promise that holds true today. And tomorrow. And forever.
